

From the Pastor

Welcome to September and the beginning of the Fall cycle of life in 2024! So much begins in this month and season that I often think of it as the actual calendar new year. And while the traditional new Church year begins on the first Sunday of Advent, so many plans, programs and projects begin in September that I often think of this month as the launch of our new year of community life together as well.
